SAFETY FOR YOUR CHILDREN

It has come to our attention that many of our pupils who cycle to and from school do not wear helmets. We have had at least 3 incidents of pupils returning to school or arriving at school having fallen off their bikes and they have required medical treatment. Whilst these were fortunately not serious incidents, a bump to the head could be significant, or even fatal.

We have seen an increase in the amount of litter dropped outside of school on Pooltown Road, sometimes during the evenings and nights, but also after drop off and pick up. Please ensure you and your children are not contributing to this. Could parents who drive also ensure that engines are not left running when your car is pulled up in the area.
